


Caribbean Sea






- ► Similarities of Latin American nations?

 - ▶ Latin-American South & Anglo-American North




► Western Highlands

 - ▶ High pop. of mestizo




► Tropical Coasts/Lowlands

 - ► Largely ignored
 - ▶Industrial/Agricultural Revolutions




American Exceptionalism?







- ► Disruption of physical ecology
