





 - 650s-338 BCE = rule by Council





- 700s BCE = Sparta invaded Messenia



City-State: Sparta

 - Three-tiered social structure: homoioi, helots, perioeci
- 700s BCE = Sparta invaded Messenia
- 600s BCE = Sparta invaded Thyreatis (failed)
- Lycurgus & Reform
 - Emphasis on collective honor
 - New government = two kings, council of elders
 - "ephors" = administrators




City-State: Sparta

- Peloponnesian League









 - 594 BCE = Solon






